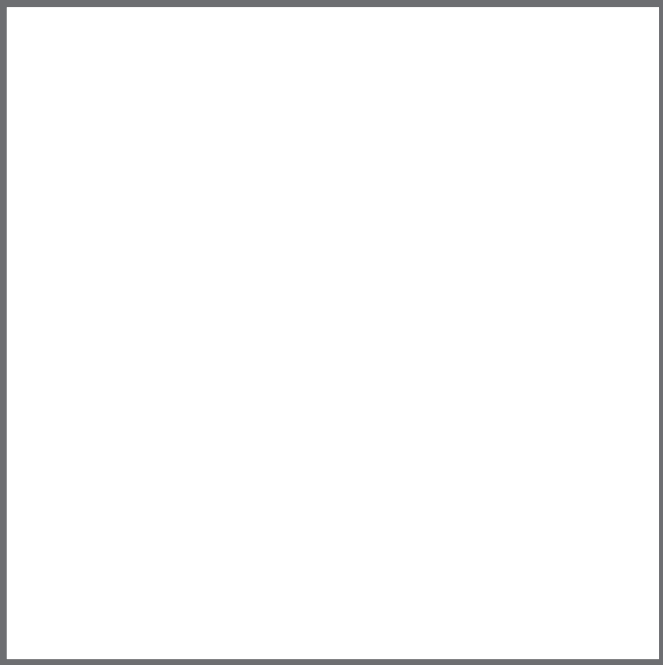

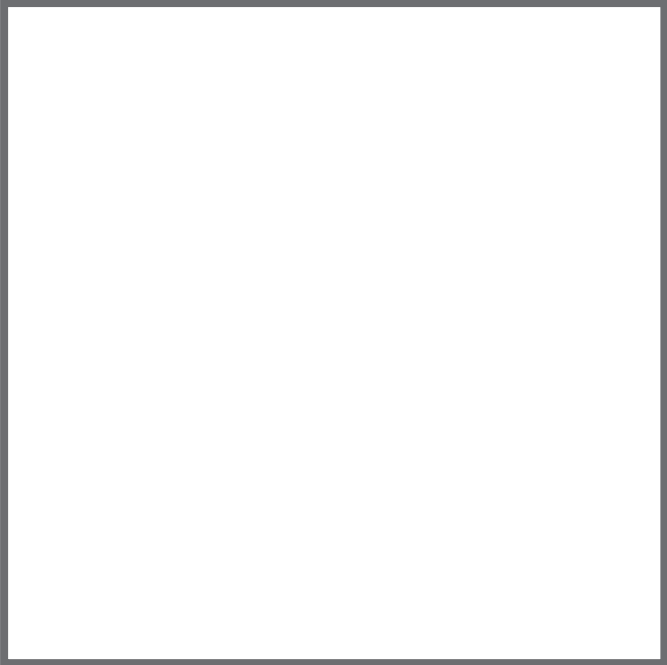

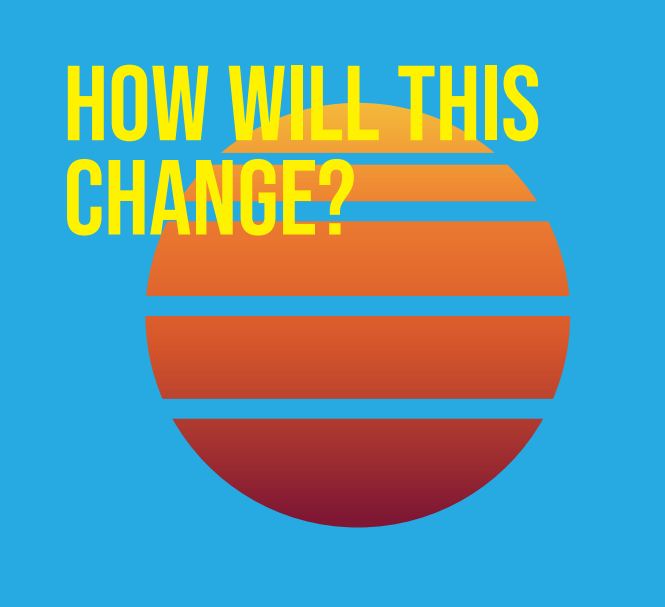

DIRECTIONS:

SYMBOL SPRAYER

Start by making sure your Document settings are correct!

1. Under File > Document Color Mode we need to be in CMYK.
2. Under Effects > Document Raster Effects Settings....we need to make sure we are set to a Resolution of Medium (150 pixels).

1. Symbol Sprayer: GRIME

1. We are going to start by opening the Symbols Panel
2. Chose the **Vector Grime** Symbol
3. Activate the **Symbol Sprayer Tool** (Shift + S) in the toolbar and set the diameter to 20 pt and then spray in exercise 1 box to the right.

2. Editing a Symbol: GERBERA

1. In the Symbols Panel chose the Gerbera Daisy option & double click.
2. This will take you into isolation mode for this object. Change the colors of the petals.
3. When you have finished, hit escape. Then spray your new flower in Exercise 2 box.

3. Creating a Symbol

1. Using the Butterfly image I have provided, select the image with the Selection Tool
2. Using the Symbols panel, Hit the + to add a New Symbol.
3. Name it Butterfly. Change the type to Graphic and leave it on Dynamic.
4. Then using the Symbol Sprayer tool, spray some butterflies in the Box 3

TRANSPARENCY

4. Transparency: Opacity

1. Click on the Hello Bubble in the box and then open the Transparency Panel
2. Change the opacity to 65%

5. Transparency: Blend Mode: Click on the Text and Sun in box and with Transparency Panel still open, change the Blend Mode to Difference.

6. Transparency: Blend Mode: Using the stripes I gave you, figure out which Blend mode I used to create this _____ and type the answer here: _____



7. TYPE: TEXTING WRAPPING

1. Create a text Box and type in a single letter at 72 pt font size.
2. Create a new text box, change the font size to 12 pt and go to Type > Fill with Placeholder Text.
3. Create a 8 sided Polygon with a radius of 90 pt
4. On both the Single letter and the Polygon, go to Object > Text Wrap > Make
5. On both the Single letter go to Object > Text Wrap > text Wrap Options and change the Offset to 10 pt and then Make your Text Wrap.

Hint: You object that is being wrapped must be arranged to front!

8. GRAPHICS STYLES

1. Using the Selection Tool, select the Moon ONLY
2. Open the Graphic Styles Panel and go to the Panel Menu > New Graphic Style...
3. Name the style Moon and click OK
4. Next use this new Graphic Style and apply it to the Stars in the image.
